

BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP TEMPLE TALK

Consider the wonderful apple pie. My OH My I love pie, especially apple pie with a crust just as flakey as a seasoned politician, not too sweet and a firm filling, warm but certainly not hot. It is hard for me to accept the fact that some people do not really care too much for my definition of the perfect piece of pie. Someone else might prefer their apple pie hot right out of the oven, another cold with ice cream on top; and maybe not sweet at all, but more like apple sauce. The next person might just prefer cherry or even apricot / pear. One could even venture to imagine that given a large group of people the subject of pie could be controversial enough to drift into argument.

With this year being an election year it is nearly impossible to not hear a rhetorical spew of political propaganda issuing from the campaign headquarters of the hopeful candidates, and then echoed by the media with a particular slant that is in compliance with a company policy and or an agenda. We witness the supposed peaceful protests of upstart groups that claim to have a mission that matters, and see the aftermath that follows in reality; that of buildings burning and broken lives. For years our country has been assaulted, not only by radical terrorists, but also by a public force driving a wedge into any potential crack, resulting in a divisive society that is straining under the weight of the applied oppression. These are hard times, both financially and socially. Ideally, our daily activities conducted during these times are exercised in a faith based lifestyle.

It is with faith that we can look through the events of these days and realize that its passing is as sure as the sun rise. The Apostle Paul wrote to us in the book of EPHESIANS 6:10 - 16, giving us knowledge of the power of the faith. We can read the several letters written to us by Paul and have hope, real hope with the power of faith backing it up (2 CORINTHIANS 1:9 -10). The faith and hope of Paul lives today in his letters and in **our** faith, giving us hope and knowledge that these things will help us in the coming day, but the greatest gift is love (1 CORINTHINANS 13:13). We really, really can love our way through the mess we have assembled as a society.

Each of us is the steward of our own faith. We do not go through our lives acting instinctively, but rather have the God given ability to decide our actions. We can decide to be faithful disciples by thoughtfully considering the events we witness in our lives and asking ourselves: "What is God saying to me? What am I going to do about it?" We can decide to have intentional spiritual growth by participating in prayer groups in our own Church, attending Bible study, and reaching out to persons that might not be aware of the opportunities presented by faith, hope and love.
