

I have always heard it said that we are in the business of kingdom building. Usually people cite Acts1:8 as a reference for this church mentality:

> But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.

So, we grab onto this verse and we start running with it, "Let's go Evangelize!" And the event planning takes off. But there comes a point where we have to carefully look at all the stuff we do and make a distinction about why we are doing it.

I think there is a vast difference between "kingdom building" and "Kingdom building." And it is not just the changing of a letter to a capital (though that makes it more obvious.) It really is all about focus and implementation.

Kingdom building is really about sharing the Gospel with people through our work in the faith. We have spent a good bit of time this year hearing and seeing Jesus doing exactly that in the Scriptures. His ministry centered on "repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1:8.) It was about building the Kingdom through the interactions He had with people.

And then in Acts, the apostles were commissioned to go about that work in ever-widening circles. (The circles reaching farther out from the pebble dropped in the water.) They were sent out to build the Kingdom.

The issue arises when we start letting our kingdoms get in the way of His Kingdom. It is our nature to take possession and ownership. It is why Jesus had to tell Peter to "Get behind me Satan" and why Judas ultimately betrayed Him. Our kingdoms, events, groups and places of leadership, become our focus more than the reason for their existence.

It is innocent enough, I think. We want to do Kingdom work and use our little kingdoms to do that. But, when the little kingdoms become more important than the work that they are supposed to support, we have put our needs and desires squarely in front of God's and we have lost perspective.

So, we must be on guard! Keep God where He should be in this process. We are about Kingdom building. He must be the most important thing. Approach everything you do with the thought, "Am I putting God's desire or my desire first in this process?" Letting our vision get soft on His work through us, through the church, and in this world can be a very dangerous thing. We should always be about making sure that the Gospel is the main message, first and foremost. So, stay focused on Him and His kingdom, not the stuff that we claim as our own.

- 33rd Kairos Retreat Weekend on October 23-27, 2024
- Funds could be used to help cover the expenses of this year's and future retreats at the Stevenson Unit (Average cost for retreat is \$14,000)
- Kairos Prison Ministry brings the light, love, & friendship of Jesus Christ into the lives of prisoners and their families
- * Prisoners learn they are forgiven, and they learn they are loved thru this life changing and often lifesaving experience
- * The Retreat Weekend is based on a series of talks, discussions, chapel meditations, and creating a Christian community
- * The concept is to build the Christian community inside the institution where the Kairos Community prays and fellowships together on a regular basis (these are called 'Prayer and Share' groups that meet weekly)
- Prison violence and recidivism rates are greatly reduced when the Kairos Ministry grows in the prison

SOUTH TEXAS CHILDREN'S HOME MINISTRIES

- Headquartered outside Beeville, in Pettus, Texas
- Ministries include: Homes for Children, Homes for Families, Family
- Counseling, Pastoral Care, Family Support, Ministry Consulting
- STCH seeks to be an extension of the child's home as they partner with parents, grandparents, or other legal guardian to restore relationships and return children to their families when possible
- Children placed at STCH live with house parents and each cottage functions like a normal household, with meals in the home and the family enjoying activities together
- The children attend public schools & local churches, and participate in sports & a variety of life-building activities
- Benefits include:
- Quality care in a single home environment in a safe neighborhood for children ages 0-17
- Opportunity to grow socially, mentally, & spiritually
- A rural setting with horseback riding, and the chance to raise project animals
- Multiple professional support services, including caseworkers & professional counselors
- If a child graduates while in STCH care, STCH provides help for the student to attend college or trade schools
- Parent or legal guardian retains legal custody of the child/children

- Fund set up to distribute funds to organizations, groups, and/or individuals around the area on a needed basis throughout the year
- The fund must be depleted before the following year's H. Day Celebration

COLE OHRT WALK STRONG (C.O.W.S.) FOUNDATION

The goal of the COWS Foundation, formed in 2019, is to provide outpatient opportunities to children and adults with traumatic injuries or birth defects regardless of their ability to pay
Cole Ohrt was involved in an ATV accident in 2017 and was paralyzed from the neck down
Cole needed many hours of rehab daily and made many trips to Houston to complete his therapy & rehab

A specialized walking machine, the Lokomat Pro, has been shown to be very beneficial in assisting in gait rehabilitation for children & adults with traumatic brain injuries, spinal cord injuries, cerebral palsy, & other debilitating medical conditions

Building Kids Steps, a local certified outpatient rehabilitation facility in Victoria, houses the large walking machine and supervises its use

The walking machine and its components are currently being used by many children and adults

Fundraising efforts are on-going as new pieces to the Lokomat Pro are purchased and added to the rehab methods

This foundation helps provide support to those using the machine who may have reached their insurance maximums or those unable to pay

Money from the fundraising is in the form of scholarships that is set aside for patients who need it despite the limitations of their insurance or ability to pay

ADULT EVENING CONFIRMATION STUDY

The Latin word *confirmare*, the earliest ancestor of "confirmation," literally means "to strengthen." Paired with the word "faith," this produces an appropriate definition of "confirmation" as used in this way—it's a time to *strengthen faith*.
